- 1. Council accepted the donation of a piece of artwork from Bob Paananan.
- 2. Council approved the installation of a mural by the Kirkland Lake Arts Council to be installed in the lounge area of Heritage North.
- 3. Council approved the 2018 Financial Review and 2019 Budget Booklet; it will be made available on the Town's website and at Town Hall.
- Council approved the sole sourcing of a cap for the Fire Department 2/3 ton truck from Weber's Fabrication out of St. Jacobs, Ontario. This manufacture is used by the Ontario Fire Marshall's Office.
- 5. Council approved the request of 100 free passes for the Museum and Complex for the 2019 Northern College Students.
- 6. Council approved Fall Residential Free Tipping Fees at the Kirkland Lake Landfill Site from September 23 29, 2019.
- 7. Council directed Staff to postpone the Community Improvement applications to be considered as part of the 2020 Budget Year.
- 8. Council voted to offer 2/3 landfill tipping fees for the purpose of revitalizing the former Park Lane building at 4 Government Road West for work completed prior to June 30, 2020.
- 9. Council passed the following bylaws:
  - a. Execute an agreement with CGIS for Land Information Management
  - b. Sale of Hilton Lots
  - c. Add Crystal Gorman to the Recreation Committee
  - d. Allow storage containers at 18 Prospect Avenue
  - e. Sale of 1 Brown Avenue and amalgamate with abutting lot
  - f. Execute an agreement with Octant Aviation for a cyclical review of the instrument procedures at the Kirkland Lake Airport.
