

Council Decisions – October 15, 2019

1. Council received a delegation from the Kirkland Lake Aquatic Club Stingrays and approved their request to the 2019 Sports Tourism Program.
2. Council received a delegation from the Kirkland Lake Gold Miners and waived the 2019 portion of the dressing room fees.
3. Council received a delegation from a committee from Nettie Lake; a committee is being organized to speak on behalf of the lake residents to Council and the Town.
4. Council directed the Acting Chief Administrative Officer to hold consultations with the public and accommodation providers to introduce a Municipal Accommodation Tax and bring back a summary of the consultation, along with a proposal for the structure and overall implementation.
5. Council supports the Council of the Town of the Blue Mountains in its petition to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, that a searchable database be created, and made available, of all matters placed before all Integrity Commissioners within the province and the resolution of such matters.
6. Council approved the requests from CJKL Spooktacular and Early On Years Programming for swim passes to be given to school-aged children from Halloween.
7. Council approved the request from the Royal Canadian Legion for Remembrance Week activities.
8. Council approved submitting an application to the Ministry of Long-Term Care for the future Build or Redevelop Existing Long-Term Care Beds Fund.
9. Council directed staff to suggest suitable locations for the operation of a mobile refreshment vehicle.
10. Council passed a bylaw to sell 70 and 72 Balsam Avenue.
11. Council passed a bylaw to formalize a lease agreement with the Rotary Club of Kirkland Lake for the park at 2 Government Road East.

Mayor Kiely met with a representative of the Festival's Committee upon hearing the news of their hiatus. He congratulated all of the volunteers for their hard work and commitment to the events over the past 19 years.
