

COUNCIL DECISIONS – MARCH 9, 2021

- 1. Council received a verbal COVID-19 update
- Council resolved to have staff be directed to keep the ice in at the Complex until the end of the KLMHA season, April 30, 2021, or until required by THU as well as to reduce all storage room rates for user groups by 20% and by 50% for groups who rent dressing rooms for their clubs
- Council received the 2020 Annual/Summary Report for the Kirkland Lake Drinking Water System
- 4. Council received the 2020 Summary of Remuneration and Expenses for Elected Officials and further resolved to keep their pay at the 2018 rate when first elected
- 5. Council referred the off-road vehicle by-law report to the next Regular Meeting of Council for further information from MTO
- 6. Council resolved to have staff be directed to investigate lighting around the Kinross pond trail parameter as well as opportunities for funding to off-set the cost.
- 7. Council passed a by-law to appoint and execute an agreement with Don Studholme to be the Interim CAO
- 8. Council passed a by-law that delegates authority to Don Studholme as Interim CAO
- Council discussed considerations for suspending Pat Kiely's remuneration as a penalty to a contravention of the Code of Conduct as found by an Integrity Commissioner report presented at the February 16, 2021 Regular Meeting of Council. No motion for further action was presented.
- 10. Council received a request from Central School for placement of cranes at Town facilities and resolved to have staff be directed to request cranes for Town Hall and the Joe Mavrinac Community Complex
- 11. Council received an advertisement for a call for applications for vacant Committee Members
- Council received correspondence from MMAH that outlines a second round of funds to be received for COVID-19 Recovery Funding. TKL is expected to receive \$39,828.00 in two installments – 1 in May and 1 in November.
