

## **COUNCIL DECISIONS – APRIL 6, 2021**

- 1. Council received a petition from Alata Clarkson for being against the proposed Timber Harvest on the Swastika lands.
- 2. Council resolved to have staff be directed to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for harvesting on the Kirkland Lake Landfill Block and not to include any of the proposed Swastika lands. Staff have been directed to report back to Council with the feasibility of designating Block Ten (Swastika) as a municipal conservation area or recreation area. Staff have been directed to also report back on the feasibility of partitioning mining claims abutting the Blanche River for residential or recreational development. Staff have been directed to allocate a portion of any revenues generating through harvesting towards the cost of updating the Landowners Management Agreement.
- 3. Council received a verbal COVID-19 update.
- 4. Council resolved to have staff be directed to initiate the procurement of the ice plant upgrade to ensure it can be manufactured and installed in 2021 and to have staff budget funds yearly for a reserve towards the next ice plant upgrade.
- 5. Council resolved to have staff be directed to implement the 6 major recommendations from the Service Delivery Review for Facilities.
- 6. Council approved \$10,000 from the Community Improvement Plan to Karen Suykens for 14 Government Road West.
- 7. Council approved a Recruitment and Selection Policy.
- 8. Council resolved to move forward with recruiting a CAO in house utilizing the Interim CAO, Human Resources Supervisor, Councillor Wight, Councillor Shaba and Councillor Owen.
- 9. Council passed a by-law appointing Amberly Spilman as Deputy Clerk
- 10. Council passed a by-law to stop up, close and declare a laneway off Park Street as surplus.
- 11. Council passed a by-law to authorize Mayor and Clerk to execute an agreement with 268986 Ontario Inc. for an encroachment agreement for a portion of road allowance adjacent to 2 Government Road West.
- 12. Council received a verbal notice for a Public Meeting on April 20th to consider the new TKL Zoning By-Law.
- 13. Council received an amended Corporate Calendar adding another Council meeting in May.
- 14. Council received the 2020 Provincial Offenses annual report.
