

Council Decisions – December 14, 2021

1. Council received a verbal COVID-19 update
2. Council received a 2021 Capital Budget update and approved the transferring of funds from certain reserves to fund the identified shortfalls
3. Council approved the proposed reserve and reserve fund year-end transfers
4. Council received statistics on TKL employee vaccination rates
5. Council approved an updated Signing Authority Policy
6. Council received an update on the Council Chambers IT system and Council directed staff to allow members of the public to attend meetings again and have staff implement the usage of online forms for COVID screening
7. Council directed staff to advertise for vacant committee positions and approved the 2022 Council calendar
8. Council directed staff to enforce the overnight winter parking restrictions as needed
9. Council approved waiving tipping fees for 47 Kirkpatrick Street and directed staff to add costs to the tax roll and to bring back an updated Tipping Fee Reduction policy for consideration
10. Council approved a transfer of \$5,596.80 net of HST from the infrastructure capital reserve to fund the installation of a new furnace for Animal Control
11. Council directed staff to identify the SCADA upgrades at the KL Water Treatment Plant as the recipient project for the 2021 municipal allotment under the Northern Ontario Resource Development Support Fund
12. Council received an economic development corporation briefing
13. Council passed a by-law to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute a recreation license renewal agreement for lands legally described as Part 1, TER-381 with Ontario Infrastructure and Lands Corporation
14. Council passed a by-law to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute documents related to the sale of Parts 1, 2, 3 and 4, 54R-6235 to Kirkland Lake Gold Inc.
15. Council passed a by-law to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to execute an agreement with Product Care Association of Canada for safe handling of hazardous and special products and associated containers
16. Council passed a by-law to establish user fees for the Corporation of the Town of Kirkland Lake
17. Council passed a by-law to establish fees for the Kirkland Lake Cemetery
