- Heating Equipment
- Cooking Equipment
- Cigarettes
- Carbon Monoxide



What's the risk in March?

- 9% of annual loss fires occur in March
- Average of 52 injuries
- Average of 9 fatalities
- Top ignition sources: Cooking equipment, Heating equipment (#1 for fire with no loss/injury), Cigarettes

ENBRIDGE GAS SAFE COMMUNITY PROJECT ZERO



Kirkland Lake Fire Services and Enbridge Gas have partnered together in Enbridge Gas Safe Community Project Zero. This public education program is aimed at reducing residential fires and carbon monoxide deaths to zero. Enbridge Gas has provided \$250,000 in funding to the Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council for Safe Community Project Zero in 2022 and has been supporting the Safe Community Project Zero since the inaugural launch in 2009. Over the last 14 years, the program has provided more than 76,000 alarms to Ontario communities where Enbridge Gas provides natural gas service.

Kirkland Lake Fire Services received a \$3000.00 grant and its plan is to purchase Combination Smoke and Carbon Monoxide alarms for the Smoke Alarm program.
