BEARS & GARBAGE



Residents are reminded that at this time of year there is a higher potential for black bear sightings in your neighbourhoods.

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) cautions that at this time of year, natural food sources for bears can be scarce, so bears are seeking other available food sources (attractants), some of which may be available on or near your property. It is recommended that residents reduce attractants on or near residential properties by:


- Storing garbage properly and putting it at the curb for pick-up in the morning of collection day.
- · Do not miss collection day.
- Removing all bird feeders during foraging period.
- Do not place sweets or meats in outdoor composters.
- Freeze meat scraps until day of garbage pickup to help eliminate the smells.
- Clean BBQ after every use to eliminate food odors.

A well maintained property meets the following standards

- Nuisance (junk) vehicles are in an enclosed building.
- Windows do not have cracks or breaks that allow moisture inside.
- 3. Trees and shrubs are alive and show no signs of disease, and do not interfere with pedestrian and vehicular traffic
- 4. Roof is clean and all shingles are intact and in good condition. Material does not allow leaks and has proper ventilation.
- 5. Chimney bricks and mortar are intact with no cracking.
- 6. Exterior doors properly lock. Materials used are sealed from weather and provide protection from leaks.
- 7. Handrail, guardrail, and stairs provide safe, stable access for routine and emergency use.
- Siding is properly painted for weather protection and has

- 9. Soffit and fascias are properly installed for weather protection, free from loose, unsecured or missing sections
- 10. Gutters are clear of debris and allow roof drainage.
- 11. Accessory buildings (e.g. detached garage) meet the same quality conditions as the main structure.
- 12. Plants are cultivated and do not provide harborage for rodents.
- 13. Fences provide no safety hazards and are properly supported.
- 14. Property/yard is free of excess garbage, debris, and animal feces.
- 15. Grass is cut below 8 inches tall.
