



# **Council Decisions - November 2025**



The following is a summary of actions and decisions from Council at its Regular Meetings held on November 4, 2025 and November 18, 2025. ## Tuesday, November 4, 2025

- Council received a Delegation from the Kirkland Lake Gold Miners (D'Arcey McKinnon) for the following requests:
  - Municipal Significant Designation Status to fully Licence the Joe Mavrinac Community Complex (Arena);
  - Fee Reductions (eliminate rental fees for 2 years and reduce ice rental costs); and
  - Additional Ice Time Request (adding 30 minutes prior to games).
- Council approved the Minutes of its Regular Meeting held on October 21, 2025, of its Special Meeting held on October 28, 2025 and received minutes from Local and Regional Boards.
- Stemming from a Motion (9.1.) made by Councillor Casey Owens, Council resolved to modify the snow removal in the upcoming 2025-2026 Winter Maintenance Plan to include:
  - All designated school zones as high-priority areas;
  - Snow removal operations in school zones be scheduled to occur prior to the start of the school day, wherever operationally feasible; and
  - A Report be presented with recommendations on how to implement the change for the upcoming Winter Season, including any required budget considerations, operational impacts, and community consultation.
- Stemming from a Motion (9.2) made by Councillor Casey Owens, Council resolved to include the following regulatory measure in the Town's annual Winter Maintenance Plan:
  - The prohibition of snow removal operations in designated school zones during peak student travel times; specifically, one hour before, and one hour after the start, and end times of a school day, including the Second Street cross walk intersection area (Churchill Drive, Second Street, Station Road);
  - Exceptions be made only in cases of emergency or where safety would be significantly compromised by delaying snow removal; with both scenarios to be determined by the Director of Public Works, in consultation with the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO); and
  - A Report be presented with recommendations on how to implement this service delivery change effectively, including the coordination with local school boards and transportation services.



• Council resolved (by <u>by-law</u>) to approve a <u>Memorandum of Understanding</u> between the Town and the Kirkland Lake [Public] Library Board for shared services.

### Tuesday, November 18, 2025

- Council approved the Minutes of its Regular Meeting held on November 4, 2025.
- Council received a <u>presentation</u> on the <u>Official Plan Review Background Report</u> for the Town's consultant, J.L. Richards & Associates Ltd.

 Council received <u>information</u> and authorized the transition of the Town's in-house light duty fleet management to a <u>corporate-leased ownership model</u> under a Fleet Management Program.

**Note:** Supplemental Report (and by-law) on the terms and conditions of the Services Agreements between the Town and Enterprise Fleet Management Inc. will be presented on the December 2, 2025 Agenda.

- Council received <u>information</u> and authorized a Parade Permit to the Kirkland Lake District Chamber of Commerce for the Santa Claus Parade taking place on Friday, November 28, 2025 between the hours of 7 PM and 8 PM. The costs associated with the road closure for the parade was directed to be funded by the Public Works Department's portion of the 2025 Town Budget.
- Items <u>8.4 2024 Audited Financial Statements</u> (and <u>Auditor's Letter</u>), 8.5 <u>Vesting Properties 2025 Tax Sale Results</u>, and <u>8.6. Taxes Receivable as at October 31, 2025</u> were deferred at the request of the Chief Administrative Officer.
- Stemming from an open-session decision on May 6, 2025, Council received a public report for the sale of 22/24 Government Road West and 82 Government Road West to Parth Patel for the sums of \$20,000 and \$16,000, and resolved to amend Schedule "J" and Table "J" to the Town's Traffic and Parking By-Law to remove the designated municipal parking lot designation
- Council receive <u>information</u> and approved the <u>direct negotiation</u> for the Town's and Discover Kirkland Lake Website Refresh Project with GHD Digital Inc. for a 36 month Term for the one time implementation costs (\$28,782 +HST) and annual subscriptions for e-Commerce, and Microsite Bundle (\$3,676+HST) to be funded from the Economic Development Reserve, and that the annual subscription costs for the CMS Platform and the Forms feature (\$5,744 +HST) be funded through the annual operating portion of the Budget for the duration of the Agreement Term.
- Councillor Dikens withdrew her Member's Motion entitled "Financial Reporting to Council (Notice)".

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- Items No. 10.1 By-Law #25-076 Executing Land Sale (82 Government Rd. W.), and 10.2 By-Law #25-077 Executing Land Sale (22/24 Government Rd. W.) were deferred in order to allow for the Agreements of Purchase and Sale to be presented with the proposed execution by-laws in the compelling public interest.
- Councillor Shaba gave notice of a motion to bring an amendment to <u>Section 4A</u> of Council's <u>Procedure By-Law 25-062</u> Reinstatement of "Questions From Council to Staff" in Routine Order of Business for Regular/Special Meetings, to be considered by Council at their December 2, 2025 Regular Meeting.
- Mayor Wight <u>proclaimed</u> "International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women" (November 25, 2025) in the Town of Kirkland Lake.
- Stemming from the composition change materializing from the <u>Memorandum of Understanding</u> for Shared Services, Council approved to appoint Councillor Janice Ranger to the Kirkland Lake [Public] Library Board for the remainder of this Term of Council.
