
Position Title: Supervisor of Aquatic and Recreation Services

Department: Community Services

The Supervisor of Aquatic and Recreation Services is responsible for overseeing the operations, programs, and staff of the Aquatics and Recreation Department. This includes ensuring that staff are well-trained, that aquatic programs meet community demand, and that all regulations, including Ontario Public Pools Regulations, are adhered to. The supervisor manages scheduling, event planning, and public relations, while maintaining high standards for staff conduct and facility presentation.

In terms of pool maintenance, the supervisor is responsible for the operation of pool in accordance with Health Protection and Promotion Act regulations. They ensure all necessary data is submitted to the Public Health Inspector and oversee the cleanliness and functionality of the entire aquatic facility. Additionally, they ensure that all staff are trained in WHMIS procedures and health and safety regulations to maintain a safe work environment.

The Supervisor also plays a key role in the development and supervision of recreation programs for all ages. They conduct surveys to assess community needs and incorporate these insights into program offerings. They are responsible for promoting these programs and overseeing registration. They engage in continuous professional development through conferences and workshops and collaborate with swim clubs and school boards to enhance programming. They also monitor the execution of special event programs and maintain detailed records of all activities.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION IN KIRKLAND LAKE



September 30th is National Truth and Reconciliation Day. On this day, we acknowledge the history of residential schools in Canada and honour the Survivors, their families, and the communities that experience ongoing intergenerational trauma. Understanding this shared history helps ensure that we reflect on the legacy of the residential schools in order to move towards a more inclusive Nation.

In Kirkland Lake, the Mayor has <u>Proclaimed</u> September 30th as the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation also known as "Orange Shirt Day".

For pause and reflection in the community on National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, the Town will be lighting up the "Gateway" signs at each end of Town, and Miners' Memorial in orange.





The Survivors' Flag will be raised at the Municipal Office commencing on Monday, September 29, 2025 through to Wednesday, October 1, 2025.

Creation and Meaning of The Survivors Flag

The orange and white Survivors' Flag was designed by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR) in consultation with Survivors from across Canada as an expression of remembrance. The Flag was developed through consultation and collaboration with Inuit, Mi'kmaq, Atikamekw, Cree, Ojibway, Dakota, Mohawk, Dene, Nuu-chah-nulth, Secwepemc, and Métis.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation
The Survivor's Flag

The Flag features <u>nine distinct elements</u>, each with special meaning. For example, the seeds depicted underneath the family and children represent the spirits of the children who never returned home.

Hosted by the University of Manitoba, the NCTR was created to preserve the memory of Canada's residential school system and legacy. They are stewards and share the truths of Survivors' experiences in a respectful way. They work with Indigenous and non-Indigenous educators, researchers, communities, decision-makers, and public to support works of truth, reconciliation, and healing Nation-wide.

The Survivors' Flag was first raised at Town Hall in 2022 to mark the inaugural National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The Importance of the Land Acknowledgement Statement

The Town respectfully acknowledges that it operates on land within the Robinson-Huron Treaty and unceded Indigenous territory, specifically within the traditional territories of Beaverhouse First Nation.

Acknowledging territory is the process of deliberately bringing awareness that Kirkland Lakers inhabit Indigenous land and water, and that specific Indigenous Peoples have inherent territorial rights in the community we know and love.

Establishing a statement provides an opportunity for Town

to pause and generate an opportunity for reflection of the local government's assurances of building better relationships with local Indigenous Peoples; creating a more just society.

The practice of acknowledgment was adopted by Town Council to contribute to addressing settler colonialism and give pause to everyone's relationship with the land. During Meetings of Council, the following Land Acknowledgement Statement is made prior to the business being conducted:



"We acknowledge that the Town of Kirkland Lake is located on the traditional territory of Algonquin peoples including Beaverhouse First Nation, and unceded territory of other Indigenous peoples. We recognize the presence of the Algonquin, Anishanabai, Ojibwe, Cree and Métis people in our community since time immemorial and honour their stewardship and care of these lands. We hereby affirm our continued commitment and responsibility to reconciliation."

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION IN KIRKLAND LAKE continued...

You may have noticed, many if not all Town-owned facilities feature a plaque in reception areas to bring public and staff awareness of the Indigenous territory inhabited.

How to Individually Engage in Truth and Reconciliation

Here are some suggestions on how each of us can engage in Truth and Reconciliation:

- Educate yourself surrounding Indigenous
 History and the Residential School System.
 Either virtually through NCTR Webinars or
 by heading to our local library to learn more.
 There are a number of other Resources
 available to you online such as: Residential
 School History, Indigenous Perspectives
 Education Guide, The Residential School
 System, Canada's Commitment to
 Reconciliation, etc.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's <u>94 Calls to Action</u>. A <u>child-friendly version</u> of the Calls to Action was created by the <u>First Nations Child and Family Caring Society</u> if you wish to pass the education onto your young.
- 3. Acknowledge the land you live on. Whose Land is an "App" that identifies Indigenous Nations, territories and communities to help you know where you live, work, and play. The Federal Government's GeoViewer identifies the First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples who live near you.
- 4. Listening and Learning. There is no better time to listen and learn from the Indigenous peoples in the community. Talking to Elders, attending Ceremonial events, Powwows, workshops, community groups. Listening to Indigenous persons you are acquainted with about their lived experiences will enrich your perspective. There are all kinds of television programs, podcasts, books/audiobooks and radio programs designed by, or dedicated to, Indigenous peoples and creators that are available at our fingertips.
- Indigenous 5. Support creators businesses & non-profit and organizations. Your consumerism, shares likes of Indigenous products and and services help support the local economy and assist Indigenous content creators and business awareness on social mediums. Discussing and sharing your supporting for local non-profits (i.e. Keepers of The Circle) brings awareness on the equality and wellness for all local Indigenous families within the community.

Construction has kicked off along Highway 66's connecting link in Kirkland Lake, between Goldthorpe Road and Heritage North. It's all about improving the road and installing new sidewalks, curbs, and storm pipes.

Here's what's happening during the project:

- Traffic delays are expected, so be prepared for slower travel.
- There won't be detours, but lane restrictions may apply—stay alert.
- Pedestrians are still able to get through but expect temporary sidewalk or crossing adjustments.

Reminder: Follow all posted signs, slow down, and stay cautious when traveling through the zone.

Progress continues on the Connecting Link project! Crews have completed the removal of sidewalks and curbs, and work is actively underway on the replacement of the storm sewer system.

Once the storm sewer work is complete, crews will begin asphalt removal, followed by the reinstatement of concrete curbs.

The Town of Kirkland Lake's Public Works Department is actively improving the storm water management system, with major upgrades underway in the Premier area—one of the lowest points in the network and historically prone to water congestion.

Due to aging infrastructure and significant sediment buildup, the underground stormwater pipes in this area have struggled to manage runoff effectively. To address these challenges, several outdated underground sections have been removed and replaced with open ditches. This change is expected to significantly improve water flow, reduce the risk of blockages, and provide easier access for routine maintenance and cleaning.

There are currently two new open ditches in the Premier area, each serving a distinct and critical function:

- One ditch supports the underground tunnel that discharges storm water directly at this location.
- The other ditch handles runoff from the Pollock and Dixon area, which drains into the Premier zone.

Both ditches are essential to managing the volume of water coming from these two separate sources, and their presence ensures the system can operate efficiently under heavy flow conditions.
